## Revd Hannah writes:

Pentecost is regarded as the birth of the church. The Holy Spirit touched each of the disciples as "they were all together in one place." Of course, this year, we cannot be together in one place, but by the wonders of modern technology we can be together in many places inviting the Holy Spirit into each of our homes. The Holy Spirit enabled the disciples to proclaim the gospel to lots of people in many different languages. The Holy Spirit empowered Peter to preach the first ever sermon in the church era. The success of Peter's sermon empowered by the Spirit meant that 3000 disciples were added to their number and the church's mission was launched with a flourish. Pentecost marks the gift of the Spirit being given to the church, but it is also a gift given to each one of us. The gifts of the Spirit are love, joy, peace, gentleness, patience, kindness and self-control. Pentecost offers an opportunity to ask for an outpouring of these gifts in our own lives so that we can share them with others. If we pray for an increase in the Holy Spirit in our own lives, I wonder how many more might be added to our number?

Jesus connects the life-giving power of the Holy Spirit, who is to come, with the image of living water, which sustains and refreshes all life.

The Noticeboard outside The Rectory is decorated for Pentecost with ribbons.


Pentecost Dove fridge magnets are available to take out of a pot on the notice board as you walk past.
