Reading for the Service for All the Church Family

Genesis 22:1-14

God tests Abraham's faith by ordering him to sacrifice his only son, Isaac. Abraham obeys and is about to kill Isaac, when the angel of the Lord intervenes. A ram is provided in the boy's stead.

Second Reading Romans 6:12-end

Paul urges his listeners not to succumb to sinful ways, since they are not under law but under grace. Former slaves to sin have become slaves of righteousness and God's free gift is eternal life in Christ.

Gospel Matthew 10:40-end

Jesus explains that anyone who welcomes one of his disciples receives Jesus himself and, by extension, his heavenly Father. Even the smallest gesture of kindness will be rewarded.
