## Concert in Memory of Gordon Parham, 14th July 2021 at 7pm in St Mary's Church

Gordon's daughter, an internationally known pianist, is performing a concert in his memory on the 14th July 2021 at 7pm at St Mary's Church.

Lucy Parham has created a new programme. Elegie chronicles the life of composer and pianist Sergei Rachmaninoff. Though he became an exile in 1917, Russia remained deeply rooted in his soul. His cultural identity and his longing for his homeland imbue his music, not least the many much-loved works he wrote for his own instrument, the piano. The narrative, scripted from letters and diaries, follows Rachmaninoff from his youth in Russia, through his subsequent self-imposed exile in 1917 and finally to California USA, where he died in 1943.

The concert includes many of his best-loved works for solo piano, including a selection of Preludes, Etudes-Tableaux and Moments Musicaux, some of his own transcriptions and the haunting Elégie, as well as works by Scriabin and Tchaikovsky.

Please note this is the shorter, 75 minute version of Elegie, with no interval.

**Revd Delia writes:** Last Sunday was Pentecost when we celebrated the gift of God's Holy Spirit. This week is Trinity Sunday when we celebrate the mystery of God in the three persons of Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. So packed into these two Sundays is a lot of theology to try and unravel. But if we stop and just embrace the ideas without thinking too much, and open our hearts and minds to the enormity of God, we might glimpse the immortal, invisible, omnipresence of God in our lives.

Last Sunday I had a lot to say and my sermon has been widely shared, thank you. I hope it prompts some questions and challenges in all of us as we look for God's Vision in our 3 parishes. For Trinity Sunday I will keep it simple—let us not try to unravel the mystery of the Trinity, and so let us not unravel the workings of our 3 parishes which have come together on zoom throughout the last year. Let us celebrate what we have found in each other and find new ways of being church in the days ahead.

### Today's Readings

#### First Reading Isaiah 6:1-8

Isaiah's vision of God is a multi-sensory experience. He sees and hears the Lord, but also smells the smoke, feels the shaking of the Temple, and has his mouth touched with a burning coal.

#### Second Reading Romans 8:12-17

This is Paul at his most vivid, joyful, and enthusiastic. His excitement for his faith bubbles up as he tells his readers that, when we call to God, the Spirit – God's very self – joins with us.

#### Gospel John 3:1-17

Nicodemus, a Jewish leader, has a powerful encounter with Jesus. Jesus speaks in mystical language about life, new birth, and the Spirit. It is too overwhelming for the Pharisee.

O God our mystery,  
you bring us to life,  
call us to freedom,  
and move between us with love.  
May we so participate  
in the dance of your trinity  
that our lives may resonate with you,  
now and for ever. **Amen.**

We continue to pray for our schools, colleges and universities, as half term approaches, may students and teachers have a good rest and return to school refreshed after the break.

We also pray for those struggling to cope with financial pressures because of the virus, for those people who have lost their jobs and those needing to use Foodbanks

We pray for areas in the world facing conflict and war.
