Concert in Memory of Gordon Parham, 14th July 2021 at 7pm in St Mary's Church

Gordon's daughter, an internationally known pianist, is performing a concert in his memory on the 14th July 2021 at 7pm at St Mary's Church. Lucy Parham has created a new programme. Elegie chronicles the life of composer and pianist Sergei Rachmaninoff. Though he became an exile in 1917, Russia remained deeply rooted in his soul. His cultural identity and his longing for his homeland imbue his music, not least the many much-loved works he wrote for his own instrument, the piano. The narrative, scripted from letters and diaries, follows Rachmaninoff from his youth in Russia, through his subsequent self-imposed exile in 1917 and finally to California USA, where he died in 1943.

The concert includes many of his best-loved works for solo piano, including a selection of Preludes, Etudes-Tableaux and Moments Musicaux, some of his own transcriptions and the haunting Elégie, as well as works by Scriabin and Tchaikovsky.

Please note this is the shorter, 75 minute version of Elegie, with no interval.

Revd Hannah writes:

This week as we explore the well known story of the Good Samaritan, it is a salient reminder of the importance of kindness. A simple act of kindness can have a huge impact—it maybe helping a neighbour with some shopping or a lift. Last year, during height of the pandemic, I was amazed by the offers of help from our communities to those who were isolating and shielding. Unfortunately, as we have seen wonderful acts of kindness and neighbourliness in the last year, we also see examples of unkindness. An example of this is some of the vitriol and dreadful comments that are expressed on social media and twitter. Many of these comments would have been said in the privacy of peoples homes but now they are splashed on various platforms. Our words and actions matter. We may not always like our neighbour and I am using “neighbour” in the broadest sense but we are called to love them.

Today's Readings**First Reading** 1 Samuel 15:34 – 16:13

If God chose Jesse's youngest son, not the tallest or strongest or most experienced, perhaps we too can be of service.

Second Reading 2 Corinthians 5:6-10 [11-13] 14-17

Paul reassures us that Christ died for all, and it is through faith in him that we will be judged, not by any human assessment.

Gospel Mark 4:26-34

Taken together, these two parables suggest that the kingdom can grow from small seeds like us, with God's help. Jesus would explain this further to his disciples.
