Concert in Memory of Gordon Parham, 14th July 2021 at 7pm in St Mary's Church



Gordon's daughter, an internationally known pianist, is performing a concert in his memory on the 14th July 2021 at 7pm at St Mary's Church. Lucy Parham has created a new programme. *Elegie* chronicles the life of composer and pianist Sergei Rachmaninoff. Though he became an exile in 1917, Russia remained deeply rooted in his soul. His cultural identity and his longing for his homeland imbue his music, not least the many much-loved works he wrote for his own instrument, the piano. The narrative, scripted from letters and diaries, follows Rachmaninoff from his youth in Russia, through his subsequent self-imposed exile in 1917 and finally to California USA, where he died in 1943. The concert includes many of his best-loved works for solo piano, including a selection of Preludes, Etudes-Tableaux and Moments Musicaux, some of his own transcriptions and the haunting *Elégie*, as well as works by Scriabin and Tchaikovsky.

Please note this is the shorter, 75 minute version of *Elegie*, with no interval.

Revd Delia writes:

This Sunday's Gospel reading reminds us of Jesus power over nature at a time when like most Brits I feel enough is enough, when is it going to cool down?! We have no control over the weather and of course we love to talk about it and moan about it—too hot, too cold, too wet, we are never satisfied.

Yet all we need to do when it is too hot is to slow down and trust that God will send the rain. So it is in our spiritual lives, we may feel disconnected and dissatisfied with our lives, but we can trust that Jesus is still within a hands reach, waiting to be asked to join us on our spiritual journey. Just as the disciples were saved from the storm by asking Jesus for help, so can we be saved and refreshed by asking Jesus to accompany us on our journey.

Today's Readings**First Reading** Job 38:1-11

The Lord counsels Job from the whirlwind, assuring him that it is God who has set the foundations of the world, as well as the limits around Job's suffering. Job is not alone, but all his trials take place within a larger narrative written by God.

Second Reading 2 Corinthians 6:1-13

Paul is encouraging the new Christians at Corinth and trying to get them to open their hearts wider to God. Paul is honest and vulnerable with them, demonstrating his faithfulness in good times and bad as a servant of God.

Gospel Mark 4:35-end

Jesus is asleep in the boat as a storm rises and the elements threaten to overwhelm him and the disciples as they cross from one side of the lake to another. The disciples wake Jesus and he demonstrates his command over nature itself. The disciples are awestruck and Jesus rebukes them for their timidity of faith.

Collect

God our saviour, look on this wounded world in pity and in power; hold us fast to your promises of peace won for us by your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen

As we reflect on the power of Jesus to calm the storm on the lake, help us to look to God in the storms of our own lives and seek comfort and protection from him.

We thank you for our beautiful world and for your creation. Help us to care for our planet and not misuse or abuse it's resources. We look for the coming of peace on earth—peace in our hearts, our homes, our communities and the whole earth.

Risen Christ, may you be known to us and to our neighbours far and wide. Guide the leaders of the nations to use their powers for the good of their people. Particularly in the fight against Covid and the fair distribution of the vaccines.

We give thanks for the continuing work of the scientists in fighting diseases, for all medical breakthroughs and the roll out of the vaccines. We pray for the those working in the NHS, in care homes and social care.

Help us to be patient and sensible as we live through a pandemic and the restrictions that limit our lives in order to protect us.

We pray for your healing and restoration to all those who are suffering in body, mind or spirit.

We continue to pray for our schools, colleges and universities, as they begin a new half term.

We also pray for those struggling to cope with financial pressures because of the virus, for those people who have lost their jobs and those needing to use Foodbanks.

We pray for areas in the world facing conflict and war.

We pray especially for those who are struggling with their mental health at this time, for those who are unwell & those who have gone to their rest in you.
