**Concert in Memory of Gordon Parham, 14th July 2021 at 7pm in
St Mary's Church**



Gordon's daughter, an internationally known pianist, is performing a concert in his memory on the 14th July 2021 at 7pm at St Mary's Church. Lucy Parham has created a new programme. Elegie chronicles the life of composer and pianist Sergei Rachmaninoff. Though he became an exile in 1917, Russia remained deeply rooted in his soul. His cultural identity and his longing for his homeland imbue his music, not least the many much-loved works he wrote for his own instrument, the piano. The narrative, scripted from letters and diaries, follows Rachmaninoff from his youth in Russia, through his subsequent self-imposed exile in 1917 and finally to California USA, where he died in 1943.

The concert includes many of his best-loved works for solo piano, including a selection of Preludes, Etudes-Tableaux and Moments Musicaux, some of his own transcriptions and the haunting Elégie, as well as works by Scriabin and Tchaikovsky.

Please note this is the shorter, 75 minute version of Elegie, with no interval.

Revd Hannah writes:

I think it is one of the things we take for granted—our health. I know that over the last few weeks as I recuperated from a medical procedure I have been frustrated with how tired I have felt and also at my own inability to really switch off and just get better, quickly! I can only imagine how it must feel to live with chronic, ongoing medical issues. Frankly, I am in awe of the faith of the women in our Gospel story who had been suffering for 12 years with a haemorrhaging disorder, “If I touch his cloak, I will be made well.” Receiving miraculous healing for illness can be a difficult subject in the church. There doesn’t seem to be any rhyme or reason as to why some people are healed and others are not. I am convinced that illness is not a punishment from God. Illness and pain are a part of being human. God does heal in all sorts of ways which we see demonstrated in our gospel and God is with us in our pain and suffering. I found the following prayer on Lectio 365 which has reminded me to offer my recuperation to God:

“Lord, may I have the courage to stop running when I really need to sit and rest. May I be honest with myself to know when to admit, ‘Lord, I’ve had enough.’ And may I be wise enough to know when to cease my anxious prayers and just lie down and sleep.” Amen

Today’s Readings

First Reading 2 Samuel 1:1. 17-end

David’s deep lamentation is about the loss of leaders, the loss of fighters, and also about personal loss – the loss of a deep relationship, about which many have speculated, expressed with moving tenderness.

Second Reading 2 Corinthians 8:7-end

The church in Corinth shows many virtues but they are here encouraged to go further and not just talk of love, faith and other virtues, but to show it in their willingness to share what they have with others who have less.

Gospel Mark 5:21-end

Two women in deep need, one old and one young, find that the touch of Jesus brings wholeness to them but at some cost to him.

Gracious Father, by the obedience of Jesus you brought salvation to our wayward world: draw us into harmony with your will, that we may find all things restored in him, our Saviour Jesus Christ.

Risen Christ, may you be known to us and to our neighbours far and wide. Guide the leaders of the nations to use their powers for the good of their people. Particularly in the fight against Covid and the fair distribution of the vaccines.

We give thanks for the continuing work of the scientists in fighting diseases, for all medical breakthroughs and the roll out of the vaccines. We pray for the those working in the NHS, in care homes and social care. Help us to be patient and sensible as we live through a pandemic and the restrictions that limit our lives in order to protect us.

We pray for your healing and restoration to all those who are suffering in body, mind or spirit.

We continue to pray for our schools, colleges and universities. We also pray for those struggling to cope with financial pressures because of the virus, for those people who have lost their jobs and those needing to use Foodbanks.

We pray for areas in the world facing conflict and war.

We pray especially for those who are struggling with their mental health at this time, for those who are unwell & those who have gone to their rest in you.
