## Concert in Memory of Gordon Parham, 14th July 2021 at 7pm in St Mary's Church



Gordon's daughter, an internationally known pianist, is performing a concert in his memory on the 14th July 2021 at 7pm at St Mary's Church. Lucy Parham has created a new programme. Elegie chronicles the life of composer and pianist Sergei Rachmaninoff. Though he became an exile in 1917, Russia remained deeply rooted in his soul. His cultural identity and his longing for his homeland imbue his music, not least the many much-loved works he wrote for his own instrument, the piano. The narrative, scripted from letters and diaries, follows Rachmaninoff from his youth in Russia, through his subsequent self-imposed exile in 1917 and finally to California USA, where he died in 1943. The concert includes many of his best-loved works for solo piano, including a selection of Preludes, Etudes-Tableaux and Moments Musicaux, some of his own transcriptions and the haunting Elégie, as well as works by Scriabin and Tchaikovsky.

Please note this is the shorter, 75 minute version of Elegie, with no interval.

### Revd Delia writes:

### Today's Readings

#### First Reading 2 Samuel 5:1-5. 9-10

David is anointed king by the Israelites – they call him shepherd, indicating the king's role in protecting the community. Jerusalem is established as the City of David.

#### Second Reading 2 Corinthians 12:2-10

Paul speaks of an experience of spiritual rapture that he finds hard to put into words, and of a human weakness through which he learns to depend on God instead of on his own inner resources.

#### Gospel Mark 6:1-13

Jesus is admired and then rejected by his own people. Then he sends out the disciples, telling them what to do when they too are rejected. Even with all the rejection, miracles still occur.

#### Collect

Almighty and everlasting God, by whose Spirit the whole body of the Church is governed and sanctified: hear our prayer which we offer for all thy faithful people, that in their vocation and ministry they may serve you in holiness and truth, to the glory of your name; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.
